- Economic Development: Business retention and expansion, new business development, and tourism. leadership, problem-solving skills, self-reliant
- Education and Youth: Emphasize STEM, fine art, and educational programs; combat critical social problems in children and teens at risk; Promote physical wellness and encourage youth participation in physical and mental fitness activities.

- Disaster Relief: Provide disaster relief in the form of food, clothing, shelter, clean up, repairs, and reconstruction in an emergency or following an accident, severe storm or other causes.
