Prepare before the cold winds blow and save all winter

Take advantage of energy-efficiency tax credits before the year ends

Some energy-efficiency improvements cost a lot of money. But they are much, much more affordable thanks to the Internal Revenue Service's residential energy-efficient property credit through Dec. 31, 2016, for 30 percent of the cost of the qualified property.

Per the IRS, there is no cap on the

amount of credit available, except for fuel cell property. Generally, you may include labor costs when figuring the credit, and you can carry forward

any unused portions of this credit.
Qualifying equipment must have been installed on or in connection with your home in the United States; fuel cell property qualifies only when installed on or in

fies only when installed on or in connection with your main home in the U.S.

The following types of equipment

are eligible:

- Solar panels
- Solar-powered water heaters



- · Geothermal heat pumps
- Photovoltaic systems
- •Small wind energy systems

• Fuel cells

Be sure you have the manufacturer's tax credit certification statement, which can usually be found on the manufacturer's website or with the product packaging.

If you're eligible, you can claim both of these credits on Form 5695, Residential Energy Credits when you file your federal income tax return. Note these are tax credits and not deductions, so they will generally reduce the amount of tax owed dollar

for dollar. Finally, you may
claim these credits regardless
of whether you itemize deductions on IRS Schedule A. Verify with
your tax preparer that you qualify for
this tax credit as individual situations

INSULATION IS THE KEY...Use the above diagram for ideas on key areas to insulate for maximum energy savings.

Stop duct leaks, but don't use duct tape!

Ducts distribute warm air throughout your house. Because you don't see them, it's easy to forget they can become crushed or flattened and develop cracks. Duct tape (don't use it: it's not long lasting) can dry out and fall off. Uninsulated ducts also lose heat. In fact, as much as 20 percent of heated air can be lost because of faulty ducts before it even reaches the rooms you wish to heat, according to ENERGY STAR.

If last year's winter heating bills and this summer's air conditioning bills were

Say no to cold air leaks

There are plenty of drafty, leaky homes out there, and not all of them are old houses. Air leaks can waste up to 40 percent of your heating and cooling dollars, according to the U.S. Department of Energy. Most of this occurs around windows and doors, but any place where outer walls meet floors or roofs and where a barrier is penetrated can be a leak source as well. Simple weatherstripping and caulking can stop most of the leaks.

Download ENERGY STAR'S scaling and insulating guide and duct scaling guide at www.energystar.gov/index.cfm?c=home_scaling.hm_improvement_scaling. These useful guides and the ENERGY STAR home scaling section offer these tips on where to look for leaks and what to do to stop them:

Seal attic leaks — Doing this will likely make the biggest impact on your energy bill. Plug the big holes first, such as open stud cavities. If your attic is finished, seal behind the kneewalls. Next, seal around the furnace flue, using proper techniques and seals. Then go after small gaps, using foam or caulk. For example, where there's dirty insulation, that insulation is acting like a filter and you'll likely find small gaps underneath to seal with caulk or expanding foam. Fill wiring and plumbing holes with expanding foam, and caulk around electrical junction boxes and fill holes in the box with caulk. If the space around your plumbing pipes is wider than 3 inches, stuff fiberglass insulation into the space. Once the fiberglass insulation is in

place, follow the directions on the can to foam the space around the pipe. Finally, weatherstrip and seal the attic hatch.

Weatherize doors and windows — Weatherstrip and caulk any holes you see; make sure doors seal properly.

Close fireplace dampers — When the fireplace is not in use, an open damper is like an open window that draws warm air out of the room and creates a draft.

Caulk or seal every duct, wire or pipe that penetrates walls, ceilings and floors — Plumbing vents can be especially bad, since they begin below the floor and go all the way through the roof. Include furnace flues and duct chaseways (the hollow box or wall feature that hides ducts).

Caulk to seal along the basement rim joists — Where the foundation meets the wood framing is often a source for leaks.

Seal electrical outlets and switches on outside walls — Use inexpensive foam gaskets that fit behind light switches and electrical outlet plates.

Caulk around heating system floor registers.

Close storm windows and doors

— Covering single-pane windows with plastic film is less expensive than replacing them with new double-pane windows.

Remove window air conditioners — This will prevent drafts and allow the windows to seal better.

Don't forget to seal around open soffits and recessed lights.

outages caused by animals go up The air is calm and crisp and the day is clear, when suddenly your power cause the monotonous "blinks" that keep the lights off only long enough to force

As the temperature goes down,

is clear, when suddenly your power goes off. You wonder what could have caused such a thing. There's not a cloud in the sky.

The bad news is, there doesn't have to be a cloud in the sky or a storm in the air to cause a power outage. Although a number of outages may be caused by high winds blowing tree limbs onto lines, the culprit in the fall of the year is likely to be of the furry or feathery variety.

"When the air begins to turn cold, a lot of times we see an increase in the amount of outages on our system that we can attribute to animals," Line Superintendent Randy Burkeybile said.

The number of outages attributed to animals can increase in the fall when squirrels begin preparing for winter. Squirrels and other animals climb on equipment, such as transformers and fuses, and the equipment shuts down in order to protect the rest of the system.

"The reason these instances sometimes tend to increase in the fall is because the transformers put off heat," Burkeybile said. "Squirrels, raccoons and other animals will climb onto the transformers for warmth, and they get into places they shouldn't be. Before you know it, there is a power outage."

Animals on the transformers can also

the lights off only long enough to force you to have to set every digital clock in the house.

"Even a wasp in the wrong place at the wrong time can blink an entire line," Burkeybile said.

Your cooperative is doing what it can to reduce outages due to animals by installing insulated "bird wire" and wildlife protection devices to prevent animals and birds from making contact with electrical equipment. These devices are not only meant to protect the electrical system, but also the birds and animals.

"Wildlife protection devices are a plastic insulating cap that goes over the exposed electrical components on transformers and breakers," Burkeybile said. "We have installed the same insulated wire and wildlife protection devices where we can in our substations."

Your cooperative is working hard to reduce the number of outages experienced by our members. When calling in an electrical outage, please be sure to have your map number available. It can be found under the "service information" section located in the center of your billing statement. Outages may be reported at 800-491-3803 or 660-584-2131.

over the top, and you have some rooms that are difficult to heat and cool, you may have leaky ducts in an attic, crawl-space or garage. First fix the ones that will make the biggest difference:

Seal those that run through the attic, crawlspace, unheated basement or garage. Use duct sealant (mastic) or metal-backed (foil) tape to seal the seams and connections of ducts. After sealing the ducts in those spaces, wrap them in insulation to keep them from

getting cold in winter and hot in summer.

Seal ducts you can access in the heated part of the house.

Make sure the connections at vents and registers are well-sealed where they meet the floors, walls and ceiling.

Missouri One Call provides you an essential service

Do you want to stay safe? Avoid expensive damages? If so, it is essential to use the Missouri One Call System to notify the utilities of your work before every type of digging project: landscaping your yard, installing a culvert, building a fence or even something as simple as installing a mailbox.

Notifying Missouri One Call before beginning any type of excavation will allow the utilities to mark their underground facilities, permitting the excavation to safely proceed. Damaging an underground line can result in injuries, expensive repair costs, legal fees and outages.

Nationwide, an underground utility line is damaged by digging once every three minutes, and one out of every three facilities are damaged as a result of not notifying the One Call center to have the facilities marked prior to digging. Using the Missouri One Call System is free, and you can process your request 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It only takes a few minutes to complete the process of notifying the utilities of your intent to dig. The utilities are then allowed three working days to respond and mark their facilities.

Notifying the utilities is easy. Here's how the Missouri One Call System works:

1. Three working days before you begin your work, call 1-800-DIG-RITE or 811 or go online to www.mo1call. com to place your locate request.

- 2. Our operators will map the dig site from excavator information and notify the utilities that have facilities in the area.
- 3. The utilities will respond by marking their facilities or notifying you that they have no facilities at the dig site.
- 4. The utilities will mark the facilities that they own, usually up to the meter.



5. Once all the utilities have responded, work can then safely proceed, avoiding damages. There are more than 20 million miles of underground facilities buried in the United States. Never dig without knowing where the underground facilities are located.
